February at Moosehead Lake features sled dog races, ice fishing, chocolate

GREENVILLE - The term "something for everybody" is often overused. But that's the best way to describe the first three weeks of February in the Moosehead Lake region which starts with sled dog races and ends with the conclusion of the Moosehead Lake Togue

Fishing Derby.

The Plum Creek Wilderness Sled Dog Races take place Saturday, February 6 at Leisure Life Resort on Lily Bay Road in Greenville. The 2015 event was a huge success with 20 mushers participating and over 200 spectators enjoying the day's festivities.

The 2016 races are shaping up to be even better since the size of the purse has doubled and registrations are coming in steadily, according to race organizers.

Competitors this year include Andre Longchamps of Pont-Rouge, Quebec, winner of last year's long-distance race; and Rico Portala-tin of Milo, who won last year's 30-mile race in Greenville and last weekend's 30-mile Maine Highlands Sled Dog race in Brownville.

Spectators can meet and mingle with the teams starting at 8:30 a.m. and the Plum Creek 70-mile race begins at 9 a.m. The West Branch Pond Camps 30-mile race will get underway at 10:30 a.m.

each and on sale at the town office.




