

Bluetooth Connectivity

Local repair shops face new challenges with today's vehicles

Few things surprise Darrell Drew, who has been repairing vehicles in his Dexter garage for more than 20 years.

"I had a 2015 Audi come in the shop for an oil change," Drew said. "When I started on the job, I discovered it didn't have a drain plug."

So Drew invested about \$120 in an evacuator "that sucks the old oil out through the dipstick," Drew said. "It's not a big investment. But it seems like the average repair shop is investing a lot more in equipment nowadays.'

Today's cars and trucks usually arrive at the dealership loaded with options, some of which were unheard of 20 years ago. They're also designed to be more reliable, thus requiring fewer trips to the repair shop except for routine maintenance.

even the more sophisticated the vehicle is, the more testing equipment is needed to correctly diagnose and fix problems.

After several years working you rotate tires." at Bangor area dealerships, Matt Blockler opened his own garage in Sangerville two years ago. "I was prepared to invest a lot of money in equipment, but it can really be a burden for a small shop," Blockler said. "The price of some testing equipment has doubled in the last 10 years."

Most Americans support funding for public transit (StatePoint) More than seven in 10 Americans support increased federal funding for the nation's public transportation systems in communities of all sizes, according to a survey conducted by ORC International for the American Public Transportation Association (APTA).

This support is broad, according to the survey, spanning various age groups and political affiliations, with some of the highest numbers among Millennials ages 18 to 34 (77 percent) and individuals age 65 and older (76 Owning or having access to a private vehicle does not diminish this support, with 71 percent of car owners reporting that they want to see more federal investment in public transportation in both large and small communities. alert drivers when something goes haywire - or is about to.

When your 'Check Engine' light comes on, it could be for a dozen different reasons," Blockler explained. "So you need the test equipment and the codes for the specific model. Otherwise, you could change every sensor in the engine and it still wouldn't

run right." Drew cited the tire pressure monitors as another driver convenience that can require some high-dollar investment for a garage. "The diagnostic tool costs \$500," he said. "If you replace one (sensor), you have to sync and program the whole system.

Dave Hall, who has operated a repair service in Greenville for the past 20 years, ran into the same dilemma. "The tire pressure monitors are convenient for the driver, but they're a challenge for the repair shops," he said. "On some models, you have to reprogram the system when

Hall said that he's spent thousands of dollars diagnostic equipment recent years and doesn't see the trend ending. "A good scan tool costs \$5,000 to start with," he explained. "Then to get updates every month costs \$1,200. We also subscribe to an online repair manual service and that's another

\$1,200." Hall also has had a few unexpected surprises when repairing late model vehicles. "I had a Chevy come in

equipped with computers that recently with a bad window switch," he said. "We were able to replace the switch, but the owner had to take it to the dealer to have the system reprogrammed."

Drew said that while today's vehicles are safer and more reliable than their counterparts 20 years ago, drivers should not take anything for granted. "If you detect something isn't right or a warning light comes on, bring it in as soon as possible," he advised. "If you postpone repairs, it will cost you more in the long run."

Blockler agreed. "Unusual engine noises could mean a timing belt is going to fail," he said. "Driver should also check their engine fluids routinely."

Hall said that rear-gear and transfer case fluids also need to be checked routinely. "Also, when you're inflating your tires, don't go by the number on the tire itself; use the pressure listed on the tag inside the driver's side door,' he said. "That figure is based on the weight of the vehicle. It's a small thing, but tires last a lot longer when they're in inflated properly."









Safe driving tips: how to get the most out of your tires

Worn tires cause more than just headaches for drivers. Less tread means longer braking distances and more difficulty handling a car. This is especially true in slippery conditions because the tires are not able to effectively clear from underneath water

Monitoring the condition of tires throughout their lives helps drivers maintain safety on the road. So, what steps should you take to ensure you get the most out of your tires?

increases. of a tire's tread. Insert the penny into the main groove so that the edge of the coin touches the tread and Lincoln's head is upside down. If the top of Lincoln's head remains visible from the groove, the tires are fully worn.

Some new tires on the market have innovative tread wear indicators to alert drivers when their tires need replacing. In fact, all new models from Nokian Tyres come fitted with a Driving Safety Indicator (DSI) that indicates how much tread is remaining, as well as a raindrop or snowflake symbol that appears once the tire has worn down to the point where the vehicle could handle unsafely on wet roads.

1. Monitor and rotate your tires.

Tires wear unevenly, es-pecially on front wheel vehicles where the front tires wear down much quicker than the rear tires. For this reason, you should monitor the tread depth throughout the season and rotate tires from front to back, providing the tire size is the same on both axles.

If a set of tires are in-stalled in the spring and used heavily until the start of autumn without being rotated, it is completely possible for the front tires to be worn down while the rear tires still have up to 70 percent of tread left.

Rotating helps to minimize the performance and differences between the front and rear of the car for more predictable handling.

2. How to measure

To help extend tread life, maximize fuel economy and optimize a vehicle's performance, it's important to check a tire's air pressure once per month in the summer and twice per month in the spring and fall when there are large fluctuations in temperature. Tire overand under-inflation cause tread to wear quicker than normal and can potentially result in a dangerous blow-Additionally, underinflation will cause your vehicle to use more fuel (or reduce range in an electric vehicle) and diminish the performance of your vehicle as it requires more effort to for the car to move.

For the most accurate pressure reading, check the tires while they are still cold. Driving heats up the tires causing the air inside to expand resulting with an inaccurate reading. The correct tire pressure for the vehicle and tire size combination can be found on a placard in the driver's door jamb, on the inside of the gas cap, or in the vehicle's owner's manual. Remember also to check the pressure of the vehicle's spare tire (if equipped).

Drivers should keep these simple tips in mind throughout the spring and summer to help ensure a safe driving vehicle and to get the most out of their tires.

Distracted driving includes hands-free talking

One of the major reasons drivers today are so distracted is one of the most surprising — pressure from your family. Indeed 82 percent of Americans feels their family pressures them the

most — above friends or employers — to drive distracted, according to a recent NSC survey.

"It is a sad irony that the people we love are actually jeopardizing our safety the most," says
Nantel. "If you really care, don't call to say, "I love you," instead encourage your family to set
everything else aside, disconnect and focus only on the road."

To prioritize safety and reduce your risk of being involved in a crash, turn your commute into "me time," and your car into a safe sanctuary. The National Safety Council is offering some tips to take back your drive.

- Turn off your phone when you get in the car.
- Tell your family (and anyone else expecting to hear from you) that you will be driving and will call or text them when you are parked at your destination.
 - · Send emails and texts before you start driving.
- \bullet Return the favor. When friends, family or colleagues are driving, refrain from placing distracting calls or sending texts.

Driver distractions have joined alcohol and speeding as leading factors in fatal and serious injury crashes. In recent years, thousands of people have died in crashes when drivers used cell phones.

The issue has started capturing the attention of political leaders nationwide and some are taking action to improve laws that promote safe driving, though no law goes far enough, say safety experts, because no law prohibits hands-free use. What you need to know when you refuel

(BPT) - On any given day, some 40 million Americans stop at gas stations to fill their tanks. For many, it's a weekly routine, one they don't spend much time analyzing, but are there things you think you know about your fill-up that just aren't true?

Andrea Kaufman considers herself a fairly conscientious auto owner, but the St. Louis Park, Minnesota resident admits she doesn't know the finer details of pumping protocol. Twe heard plenty of gas station tips and tricks, but I'm not always sure which ones I should believe." Let's set the record straight as energy experts dispel three common gas station myths.

Myth #1: It's best to buy gas early in the day.

The theory is that gasoline is denser at cooler temperatures, so you'll get more fuel per gallon early in the morning. While the basic science is correct, the experts at Consumer Reports point out two practical reasons why this is a myth. First, most gas stations store fuel in double-walled underground tanks that keep gas at steady temperatures. Second, even if there were variations, the volume difference between gasoline

at 75 versus 60 degrees Fahrenheit is just 1 percent - not enough to be noticeable at the pump.

Myth #2: It's dangerous to use a cell phone near gas pumps.

According to the Federal Communications Commission, there is no documented incident of a

According to the Federal communications commission, there is no documented incurrent or a wireless phone causing a sastation fire or explosion. It's true that many fuel companies post stickers on pumps warning motorists to turn off phones while refueling as cell phones could be a distraction. But the Petroleum Equipment Institute (PEI) reports the most likely cause of fire at the pumps is static electricity created by drivers sliding in and out of vehicles. For safe refueling, PEI recommends you turn off the car engine, refrain from smoking and stay outside the vehicle.

Myth #3: All brands of gas are the same.



Biking is a great way to get in a little exercise and have some fun, but there is a right and a wrong way to do it. Read on for some bike

Conduct a bike check

Choose the right size of bike and make sure it is in good condition. Hop onto your bike. How many inches are there between you and the bar? There should be a couple on a standard bike and five inches on a mountain bike. Place one foot on a pedal. Is your other leg slightly bent? If not, you need to adjust the seat height. Take a practice run. Are the wheels straight and secure? Do the handlebars turn easily? Can you stop quickly? If there are any problems with your bike, you need to resolve them right away.

A bike helmet is your best defense against traumatic brain injury in the event of an accident. Don't leave home without one, Get out your helmet if you have one. Does it meet the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC) standards? Look inside for a seal of approval. Does it fit your head properly? The helmet should feel snug and sit low on your forehead, with the side straps forming a Y below your ears and the chin strap tight. Shake your head. Does your helmet move? If so, you need to readjust it. If you don't own a helmet, buy one.

It is your responsibility to make sure you are seen. Wear fluorescent clothing when out and about, especially during times when visibility is low. Install front and rear reflectors on your bike and make sure they can be seen. Add a white front light for use at night if required to do so in your state. You might also want to consider adding a flashing red light to your bike.

Follow all road rules

Bikes are no different than cars on the road. Riders must follow the same traffic laws as drivers. You must ride with traffic as far right as possible and observe all speed limits and traffic lights and signs. You must also use hand signals to alert others to your actions and yield to pedestrians and other vehicles.

Re contions

Accidents can happen at any time. Avoid them by being super careful on the road. Leave your headphones at home and keep an eye out for motorists, pedestrians and obstacles. Use bike lanes when available and take a straight path. Do not weave in and out of traffic or change lanes without looking over your shoulder. Take extra caution in bad weather. Slow down and give yourself time to stop.

These are just a few tips for being a better bike rider. Safety is

important. Don't dismiss it. Take the time to inspect your bike, wear the right safety equipment and ride with caution. Short trip or long, you should never let your guard down for a moment.

Protect your investment

Boats are considered assets just like homes and automobiles, and as you know, it is important to protect your assets. To safeguard all of the time and money you have invested in your boat, you need to insure it. That way, should something happen on the water and damage occur to your boat, you can rest easy knowing that your boat is insured and you won't be out a lot of money to fix it.

If your boat measures 26 feet long or less, you will need to obtain boat insurance. If it measures more than that, you will need yacht insurance. Although the two types of insurance differ to some degree, both cover physical damage to the vessel in one of two ways: by Actual Cash Value or by Agreed Amount Value.

In Actual Cash Value policies, depreciation at the time of loss is taken into consideration. If the vessel requires repairs, a percentage of the depreciation is subtracted from the amount paid. If the vessel is a total loss, used boat pricing guides are used to determine the amount paid.

In Agreed Amount Value policies, depreciation does not factor in. If the vessel requires repairs, the amount paid reflects the cost of new parts. If the vessel is a total loss, the amount paid reflects the value of the vessel agreed upon

In most cases, the amount paid also reflects the deductible, the amount the owner agreed to pay in the event of partial or total loss. Generally, the higher the deductible, the lower the premiums are.

Determining whether to get an Actual Cash Value or an Agreed Amount Value policy can be difficult. Boat owners should find a qualified professional and discuss the pros and cons of each as they apply to their personal situation. They should explore any other variables and make sure that whatever policy they select covers all of their needs.

· Wash and wax your car thoroughly. If you can afford it, have it professionally detailed. Direct sunlight can cause a car's finish to become dull, but a thorough washing and waxing can also help keep your car's paint and clear coat looking good.

It's tempting to run the car through an automated car wash, but those big revolving brushes can dull the finish over time. If you're not allowed to wash your car at home due to regional laws or neighborhood rules, seek out a good drive-thru wash and hand wax instead.

• Check and set your car's tire pressure to the level specified in your owner's manual or on the driver's door sill. As temperatures warm up, the air in your tires can expand and that might

impact the way the car handles. Be sure not to over-inflate the tires. While low tire pressure can cause the tire to heat up if it's not rolling down the road properly, extreme over inflation can cause

a blowout in high temperatures. If you're not comfortable doing this yourself, take your car to a shop like Big-O Tires, Sears Auto Center or Firestone Auto Care Center - those kinds of chains will usually do it for free.

· Have a qualified mechanic do a visual inspection under the hood. If you're comfortable doing this yourself, check for worn belts or hoses and make sure your coolant (sometimes called anti-freeze) isn't too old. Coolant lasts a long time, but keeping track of when it was last changed, especially in older cars, can help you avoid overheating as the temperatures gradually climb.

All boat trailers are not created equal

You researched your boat before you bought it. The trailer you use to transport it is just as important, so you should research it before you buy it as well. The type of trailer you buy will depend on factors, such as the size, weight and style of your boat, what type of vehicle you will be using to haul the boat and how often you will be towing your boat.

There are two basic types of boat trailers: bunk and roller. The bunk trailer is the less expensive of the two and is suitable for deeper water. The roller trailer is suitable for shallow water. Some trailers combine the two types of technology but are more

Along with the type, you should consider the hauling capabilities of the trailer as well as its construction. The trailer you choose should be able to haul boats heavier than yours. It may be made of galvanized steel or aluminum, neither of which will rust but may decay.

Features can run the gamut. Brake and turn lights are required by law. Safety chains are essential, and the hauling vehicle must have a trailer hitch. It's illegal, not to mention dangerous, to attach a trailer to the bumper of a vehicle.

Other features are not required, but having them will make loading and unloading easier. A locking feature will attach the trailer to your boat. A load guide will help center the boat on the trailer. Smaller trailers typically have a guide hoist to get the boat on the trailer, while larger trailers have a one- or two-speed mechanical winch. A transom saver will support the boat's engine by reducing pressure. A swing tongue, swivel jack and hitch swivel will also help.

The tires on the trailer need to be weather resistant. They can be radial or nonradial. Radial tires will last longer than ply tires and offer better traction and stability and less rolling resistance. Non-radial tires are designed for use in extreme driving conditions, such as dirt, sand, snow and mud. They offer little in the way of shock absorption. You can reduce wear and tear by selecting tires with a high ply number and a large diameter.

You spent all that money on your boat. Doesn't it make sense to tow it using the best possible trailer you can afford? Imagine what would happen if you didn't.
